2022 brought Nashville's devotion to animal welfare back to full strength in what continued to be a challenging year for homeless animals. We are extremely grateful for your continued support of Metro Animal Care and Control (MACC), Davidson County's only open admission shelter.

Your support helped save more than 4,000 animals in 2022 that were abandoned, injured, or homeless here in Nashville. MACC placed nearly 3,000 homeless animals in loving homes or with rescue partners in 2022. And your support helped Friends of MACC keep more than 2,500 pets/families together by providing free food, medications, and trainings through MACC's Safety Net Program.


Lobby Remodel

With support from the Nashville Kennel Club and the goal of refreshing the lobby, we were able to add a new desk improving traffic flow and creating more space.





INCOME BY TYPE




